

Change to ordering repeat prescriptions from your GP practice



Understanding what this could mean for you



What are repeat prescriptions?

A repeat prescription allows you to get your regular medication without having to see your

doctor each time.



What is changing?

From July 2017 pharmacies and dispensing companies will not be able to order medicines on your behalf. You will need to order your repeat prescription directly from your GP practice.

There are different ways to order:


- Online if you are not already registered for patient online, speak to your GP practice
- Handing in the white, tear off part of your repeat prescription to your GP practice
- Letter to your GP practice
- Fax*



What is not changing?

If you already order repeat prescriptions directly from your GP surgery this change will not affect you.

Pharmacies that collect prescriptions from GP surgeries and pharmacies that deliver medications and other items to your door will continue to do so.

What do I need to do?

As your GP practice will not accept repeat requests from pharmacies or dispensing companies from **July 2017** you will need to order your repeat prescriptions from your GP practice when you have 7 to 10 days of medicines left.

Remember your GP practice needs 2–3 working days to issue a prescription, so don't leave it until the last minute.



Why is this happening?

This is much safer as your GP can monitor and discuss with you what medicines you may need and no longer need. So, this change greatly improves your safety and gives you more control of your medicines.

Under the old system, some patients built up a stock of unused medicines. So, we can also save money by reducing medicine waste that can be used on healthcare for more Sefton residents.
