Please find below the response to your recent Freedom of Information request regarding maximum BMI restriction on any type of surgery or procedures within NHS South Sefton CCG.

NHS South Sefton CCG was established in April 2013 and the policy has been in place since then. We cannot comment prior to this date. The policy is under review at present.
